

George Foussias, MD PhD FRCPC

Psychiatrist and Scientist

Slaight Family Centre for Youth in Transition, Campbell Family Mental Health Research Institute, and Schizophrenia Division Centre for Addiction and Mental Health

Dr. Foussias is a clinician, researcher, and head of the Virtual Reality and Behavioural Neuroscience Research Laboratory at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health. His research focuses on advancing our understanding and treatment of motivational deficits, and related negative symptoms, seen in severe mental illnesses. Dr. Foussias is also an Assistant Professor at the University of Toronto.



Nev Jones, PhD

Community Psychologist and Director

Felton Institute's CCOR (Client Centered Outcomes Research in Public Mental Health)

Dr. Jones is a researcher, advocate, and founder of the Lived Experience Research Network (LERN). Her research focuses on functional recovery and engagement within early intervention in psychosis services, transformative change in public mental health systems, and supported education. Dr. Jones is also an alumna of specialized early psychosis services and a committed advocate for systems change.



Philip Tibbo, MD FRCPC

Director / Co-Director

Nova Scotia Early Psychosis Program / Nova Scotia Psychosis Research Unit

Dr. Tibbo is a clinician, researcher, and President of the Canadian Consortium for Early Intervention in Psychosis (CCEIP). His research focuses on psychosis/schizophrenia in the areas of neuroimaging (MRS, DTI), genetics, and non-pharmacological treatment options for schizophrenia. Dr. Tibbo is also a Professor at Dalhousie University and Adjunct Professor at the University of Alberta.

EPION and the Canadian Consortium for Early Intervention in Psychosis (CCEIP) are partnering to offer a special pre-conference session for psychiatrists, psychologists, clinicians and program leadership.

The CCEIP has recently created clinical tools that address three gaps in early phase psychosis care: relapse risk assessment, monitoring of antipsychotic side effects, and decision support for selection of antipsychotics. This scientific pre-conference session will discuss the need for and development of the tools, including a review of the tools themselves in an interactive manner. The aim is to have these point-of-care tools incorporated into everyday work flow, including EMR integration.

At the end of this day, participants will be able to:

1. Apply new clinical tools developed specifically for early phase psychosis intervention
2. Identify solutions to barriers related to the integration of clinical tools into everyday workflow
3. Identify clients who would benefit from a documented formal assessment of:
 - relapse risk
 - appropriate antipsychotic therapy
 - medication side effects
